Three Obstacles We Must Overcome

- Deprecation of translation
- Dismissal of popularization
- Insistence on addressing novices as though they were experts or experts-in-training in the discipline
- Fear of being thought incompetent for not implementing the most advanced norms of the discipline in every context – i.e. tolerate vulnerability

- Scalable topics and themes
 - Important events and characters
 - Medieval roots of modern phenomena
 - Modern translations, retellings, and adaptations of medieval texts
- Gather links and bibliography for ongoing projects developing materials

Scalable Topics with Workable Iberian Focus/Texts

- Fashion (hats, footwear from platforms to cowboy boots, the social meaning of fashion choices)
- Branding from the Middle Ages to the Digital Age (Iconograph, Heraldry, Fashion)
 - Games (chess, backgammon, 15th-c. courtly games)
 - The Social History of Emotion
 - Prowess
 - Pluralism / diversity (linguistic, religious)
 - Foodies Across the Ages

Scalable Topics with Workable Iberian Focus/Texts

- Ethics / Integrity
- Bureaucracy
- Money and Commerce
- Writing, Books, Libraries: Clay to Digital
- Illustration: Beatus of Liébana to Alfonso de Cartagena's *Crónica de los reyes de España* to Graphic Novels and Comics
- Centralization and Marginalization
 - From Polities to Nation–States
 - Family (heraldry, genealogy)
- Living with Animals in the Middle Ages

Scalable Topics cont.

- Productive ongoing relationships and collaborations across disciplines, not just other (national) literatures and the usual disciplines in the humanities, but completely different fields like business, marketing, accounting, law, medicine
- Productive ongoing relationships with entities like the Society for Creative Anachronism
- All topics would support current Common Core emphases on balanced literacy and engagement with primary sources
- Many of these topics would support explorations of gender, identity, ethics, etc.

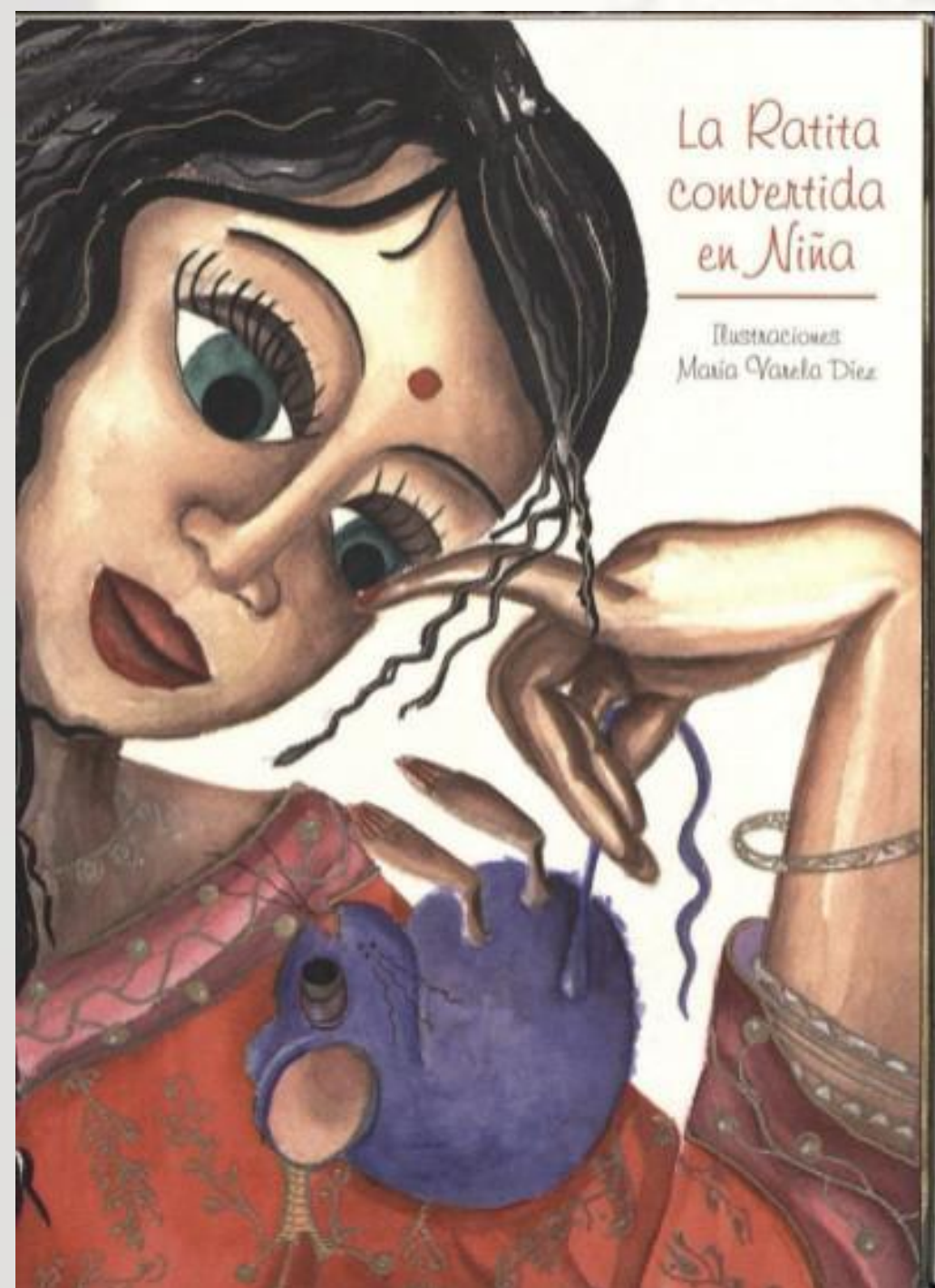
Medieval Roots of Modern Phenomena

Often with an Iberian aspect if not an Iberian “invention”

- Bureaucracy and social control
 - Law
 - Insurance
 - Banking
- Encyclopedism
 - Trade
 - Colonization
- Military technology and organization

Modern Translations, Retellings, and Adaptations of Medieval Texts

- Films, television shows, plays
- Adaptations from the 19th and 20th centuries
 - The 19th century is particularly rich in plays with medieval themes, often via the French and German studies and reimagining of the Iberian Middle Ages
 - yes, yes, I know: but it can also be quite salutary to teach what's "wrong" in those adaptations
- Modern retellings of medieval histories and stories
 - Children's books (use Getty series // ad in program)

- Make use of student writing tasks in common core.
 - Reading in World history, 7th grade, medieval – global
- Create set of units for ~3 weeks:
 - support texts
 - writing prompts
 - lesson plans
- common core aligned 7th grade, 9th grade
 - History
 - AP Spanish language
 - ID passages, structure of language, grammar
 - Task: analyze metrics, compare texts, create their own texts
 - Target advanced lower language level, particularly reading
 - SHORT but difficult is okay

- Focused readings in translation for earlier students and in Spanish, Catalan, Portuguese, etc. for high school students
